



BLACK CREATORS FORUM

The heart of the Black Creators Forum is a two-day symposium of panels, discussions, and workshops for Black filmmakers, industry professionals, scholars, and critics. The goal is to ease the barrier of entry for Black artists who would like to work in film. The Forum also supports screenings, events, and artist support programs throughout the year.

ARTIST DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM

BLACK FILMMAKER RESIDENCY & FELLOWSHIP IN SCREENWRITING

Each resident receives a \$7,500 unrestricted cash grant and a two month residency -- and an opportunity to reside in Memphis for two months, including travel and housing. Our fellow also receives a \$7,500 unrestricted cash grant and two months of support to work on her project. 




